Safe Harbor's mission is to provide services to separated and divorced families to ensure that children have continuing contact with both parents and other family members. These centers, catering to families in crisis, cut down on the opportunity for family violence, allow for parenting time/visitation in potentially high-risk situations, and allow for reintroduction of a parent or other family member. The all-volunteer staff of Safe Harbor aims to provide these services in a safe, courteous and child-friendly environment. The 501(c) 3 organization has locations in Somerset and Passaic counties.

"Some of our families would not be able to afford the fees to see their children, that other services charge," said Safe Harbor President Erik Purasson, "and other families just prefer our environment, and the kindness and dedication of our volunteer staff. People visiting children at the Centers include mothers, fathers, grandparents and other siblings. We serve as a port in the storm for families in crisis."
